






	<i>Clinopodium douglasii</i> (Yerba Buena)	Perennial ground cover, minty fragrance, tiny flowers	Trim lightly as needed	3 inches	California, found throughout the state, adaptable ground cover, grows in shade of other larger plants		https://www.anniesannuals.com/plants/view/?id=1488
	<i>Cuphea hybrid</i> "Starfire Pink" (<i>C. ignea</i> x <i>C. angustifolia</i>)	Perennial, pink and purple flowers, shiny leaves	Prune back if needed to keep shape	2 to 3 ft	Mexico -- more info on Cuphea: https://www.pacifichorticulture.org/articles/cuphea-s-at-strybing-arboretum/		https://www.gardenia.net/plant/cuphea-starfire-pink#
	<i>Lotus berthelotii</i> (Parrot Beak)	Perennial ground cover, fiery orange-red flowers	Trim lightly to shape if needed	1 to 2 ft	Canary Islands.
